# **OVERVIEW**

Moments of crisis give us windows of opportunity to think differently about our future. We have welcomed the Government's efforts to protect the most vulnerable during Covid-19; from their move to support homeless people into accommodation, to the temporary ban on evictions, to the furlough scheme which has enabled people to continue to pay their rent. How can we use this same energy to think differently about housing and homlessness in the future?

Whilst we recognise many people's experience of the recent lockdowns has been bearable due to their housing circumstance we acknowledge that for others it has been unbearable. Many people live in overcrowded accommodation, and poor quality housing. This summit is an opportunity to encourage the same bold and courageous action that has been used to develop a vaccine and to bring that energy to our national housing crisis. We will reflect on where we are as a country when it comes to housing and homelessness and how we might take action together with local and national government to stimulate the economy and build back better.

The summit is a series of roundtables, Citizens UK assemblies spread across the months of Jan-March. We will be bringing together the personal stories, energy and power of civil society from across the Citizens UK membership with the ideas and creativity of decision makers and opinion formers from national government. We hope you will be able to join us for some or all of these gatherings.

## **KEY PARTNERS**



Citizens UK is the national home of community organising. We bring the energy of faith groups, schools, universities and charities together to help solve some of the UK's most difficult problems. We successfully set up the first urban Community Land Trust with then Mayor Boris Johnson, and have since developed more schemes across the capital. Citizens UK members are well known for working to develop creative solutions to homelessness and for supporting local developments through planning.



Create Streets is a social enterprise founded in 2013, to make it easier to co-create gentle density, beautiful, resilient, successful developments with strong local support. Our work and analysis has transformed the approach being taken by the national planning system and the debate about the importance of pace-making. Our analysis including primary research on 19,000 streets and squares demonstrates the links between urban form with wellbeing, prosperity, popularity and sustainability.
